



A GREAT NIGHT OUT AT CAPITAL BEGINS WITH QUEENS

For close to three decades, Zouk has been a byword for the best of nightlife in Singapore, and after moving to Clarke Quay three years ago, it marked the start of a new chapter with the opening of Capital. Capital is a venue for patrons who appreciate life's finer experiences; a place where guests can move through different tempos and atmospheres over the course of the night. But before you hit the dance floor, you should kick off the festivities at one particular corner of Capital—the hip-hop-inspired speakeasy-style cocktail bar Queens. Here's what to expect there.

CRAFT COCKTAILS CREATED BY A TOP BARTENDER

Singapore is at the forefront of the cocktail world, and one person who's been a part of this rise is Ashwin Raj. Ashwin was a member of the 28 HongKong Street team as the pioneering bar reached the upper echelons of the Asia's 50 Best Bars and World's 50 Best Bars lists, picking up two nominations for top young bartender at the Bar Awards along the way. Brought in to helm Queens, Ashwin now mixes up signature cocktails here, along with classics and bespoke libations as requested. Among the highlights are Blaq Poet (a mix of pineapple rum, Campari, pineapple and lime juice and espresso with a touch

of cardamom) and the Shaolin Swordsmen (an Old Fashioned variation with Cynar, coffee liqueur and a saline solution). Queens also serves artisanal spirits not found elsewhere in the Zouk complex.

YOUR OWN PRIVATE LISTENING ROOM

Queens gets its name from the New York City borough that produced hip-hop stars like Run-DMC, Public Enemy and Salt-N-Pepa, so you know they take their playlist seriously. Just 30 guests at a time can soak up the intimate setting—decked out like a study with vintage vinyls—as they're taken on a journey through the genre, from old-school standards to modern tracks.

AN EARLY START TO YOUR WEEKEND

Queens is open from Thursday to Saturday each week (and on public holidays), and the proceedings kick off with easy access to Capital's ladies' night: Thursday Night Hustle. With DJ Nash D on the decks spinning everything from throwbacks to current hits, one-for-one drinks are served all night while the ladies can make the most of a free flow of house pours and selected cocktails from 11pm to 1am. Admission is free for all.

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
